

Stand is a very powerful word that we often take for granted. We stand for the Pledge of Allegiance because we show the flag respect and because this country is something we believe in. Likewise, we stand in our church services. A direct correlation of this can be found in the Gospel. Before the priest begins to read the Holy Gospel he says, “Arise!” the priest is announcing to us that it is time to hear the good news and that we should stand attentive and listen to the teachings of the Church. We also stand and proclaim the Doctrine of Faith, the Nicæan Creed—which summarizes entirely what we believe!

We stand for what we believe in. Whether it is a religious or political discussion, we metaphorically (and sometimes physically) stand, or defend our beliefs. We chose *stand* to be the theme for FDF this year because it directly correlates with each one of us.

We, as Orthodox Christians, are told to stand up for our faith. We stand up for Christ by being nice to our neighbor, by helping the poor, and by giving ourselves to God.
