

PASTORAL MESSAGE

Christ is Born! Glorify Him!

s we begin the New Year, it is important to look back on the previous year to see how far we have come. And we have had quite the year!

We began the year very strong with over 100 dancers in our Annunciation Dance Ministry and over 100 students in our Greek Education program. We sent four groups to the annual Metropolis Folk Dance and Choral Festival; T'Adelphia received First Place, Hara received costume award and Division II Sweepstakes, Nea Genia received Third Place, and Ta Zouzounakia received the Division III Participation Award. Our Greek School became a certified Ellinomatheia testing center and 5 of our students received awards from the Department of Education in Greece! Our festival this



year was a record high, with part of the proceeds going to benefit local charities! We as a parish; donated food and warm clothing to our Sacramento Food Bank and Family Services, coordinated by our Philoptochos Society. They also coordinated many successful Kid's n Cancer fundraisers, an amazing pie raffle, and a Wine Tasting night! Our Athletics Ministry sent three teams to the annual San Jose Volleyball Tournament sponsored by St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church; and our parish team "Team Nick Voresis" raised the second most money of all the teams for the annual Run to Feed the Hungry on Thanksgiving morning. During the past year, we have seen a surge of youth and young adult activities and ministries. Moms 'n Tots meets monthly for prayer and activities. Our GOYA holds monthly discussion groups and we've seen the re-creation of a Jr. GOYA (6-8th Grade) and JOY (3rd – 5th Grade), who hold monthly meetings to plan activities and fundraisers, as well as host events for our parish, like Trunk-or-Treat and our Family Game Night and Potluck. In the past year, we have also seen an active group of Young Professionals get involved in the church, from volunteering at the festival, to monthly happy hour fellowship outings, and hosted theological discussion nights (at least once a month!)

Fr. James was invited by His Grace, Bishop Neofitos of Nyeri and Mt. Kenya to share the love of Christ at a youth conference in Kenya. He led a 6-person mission team who worked and participated in the wonderful seminar. Our parish donated towards their mission and work as a diocese.

In March, we were blessed to witness the graduation from Hellenic College, Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology followed by the ordination to the Holy Priesthood of one of Annunciation's own, Fr. Panagiotis Dogias, who is now serving as the Assistant Priest at St. Katherine Greek Orthodox Church in Redondo Beach, California.

In addition to all the wonderful work our ministries have produced in the past year, our church is growing! In 2019, Fr. James and Fr. Timothy welcomed 22 people into the Church through the sacraments of Baptism and Chrismation. We also had the joy of uniting 12 couples through the sacrament of marriage.

Your stewardship provides key support for all our Annunciation Ministries who have accomplished so much in 2019, and your continued prayers and support will help us to grow and give back to our community in 2020.

This year is a big year, we are nearing our 100th year as a community in Sacramento. As we honor our past, on N Street as well as our old hall, we celebrate and give thanks to God for all the gifts He has given us; a larger church to worship in, as well as a beautiful new Annunciation Hellenic Center, where our ministries and faithful gather for fellowship, growth, and support, from Sunday School and Greek language lessons, to preserving Greek folk dance and culture, to fundraising and preparing food for those less fortunate and of course, welcoming the greater Sacramento area into our Home for our annual Festival.

As we begin the New Year, I pray that you have a blessed, healthy, and happy New Year with all of God's blessings.



LOOKING TOWARDS OUR CENTENNIAL

o you have fond memories growing-up in Sacramento? As we approach our 100th year as a Greek Orthodox parish here in California's Capitol, maybe you'd like to share some of your memories and reflect on the past, maybe even at 620 N Street, or what it was like going to Sunday School in the old Victorian house next to the current church at Alhambra and F Street. The following article was written by Mr. Bill Triphon who graciously shared his reflections and thoughts as we look toward the future.

THE ANNUNCIATION PARISH: A Retrospective view from a long time parishioner

was born in 1951 (the year the new Annunciation was dedicated) and baptized in our current church. I have fond recollections of growing up in our church in the fifties and sixties and I suppose people would call me and those like me a cradle orthodox. The importance of the church at that time was two-fold; first, the church was our religious home, and second, it served as a cultural gathering place to speak Greek and preserve the customs, culture, and values of the native homeland. The parishioners sixty years ago were comprised mainly of Greek immigrants and their first-generation children. The church helped us adapt to living in two worlds - America and Greece. The Divine Liturgy was celebrated in Greek, and when I traveled to Greece in 2005 the church service was almost identical to what I experienced as a child; it was heartwarming and brought back memories of Father Parthenios Kirmitsis celebrating the Liturgy.

During my formative years, a great number of us children regularly attended Sunday School. We lacked a formal education building, but classes were taught in the old Hellenic Center using rolling blackboards as dividers separating the classes. Our Sunday School teachers were most often professional teachers since at the time women were encouraged to go into teaching or nursing as traditional professions, and I felt the instruction was excellent. One of my happiest times was receiving Holy Communion. Many of us had immigrant parents, and we were taught to fast prior to receiving holy communion with rigid rules. However, even though I felt a sense of satisfaction when fasting, I was really excited to have donuts, pastries, or pancakes, and milk waiting for me and everyone else in Sunday School following communion. Sometimes the simplest things give the greatest pleasure. It is a happy memory that many of us treasure from that time, and we still enjoy thinking and reminiscing about it today.

During the fifties and sixties fraternal clubs were quite popular; the Messinian and Roumeli clubs and other similar organizations were made up of members from various parts of Greece, but the two largest fraternal organizations were AHEPA (American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association) which was formed in the South to combat racism and promote Hellenism and GAPA (Greek American Progressive Association) which was formed to preserve Greek language and culture. My family was in the AHEPA and my father, Ted Triphon, was secretary for over 30 years. Many other parishioners were also involved; Eugene Fotos was president of GAPA and Aris Kufasimes was president of the AHEPA; both men were patriots to both Greece and America and charismatic leaders. I was a member of the Sons of Pericles and fondly recall the conventions and basketball tournaments and other social events.

LOOKING TOWARDS OUR CENTENNIAL

In those days it felt like the church was one big Greek family and it seemed that you knew most people; Sacramento's population was much smaller, most people lived close to the church, and only one Greek Orthodox church existed. Additionally, there was a sense of community whereby, we felt that other Greeks parents were looking out for us. During that time, we children were cautious and I'd even go as far as to say we were afraid someone would see us doing something mischievous or something frowned upon, and tell our parents which would lead to our inevitable punishment.

I have a few other memories from the sixties that made a great impression on me. First, when I was serving in the altar, I met Archbishop Iakovos when he came to Sacramento and he spoke to all the altar boys which made us feel quite special. Another event of significance was when the stained glass windows were installed in the church. As a child the transformation of the church with the stained-glass windows was wondrous; the windows made God, Christ, and the Virgin Mary more real to me. The beauty of the windows was breathtaking. I'm told they came from Holland, a very famous artist by the name of Louis Boermeester, well-vested in the aesthetic tradition of Byzantine art. They cost \$1,000 each which seemed like such an exorbitant amount to me, but I could never place a monetary value on the windows since they seem to transport me closer to Christ and make our religion more tangible.

Sacramento has increased in size since then and people live farther from the church seemingly necessitating three churches in the area (Elk Grove, Roseville, and the Annunciation). Our parish is different now in that family members have passed, others have moved away, and new families have moved to Sacramento. While many people of my generation may feel as if we no longer know many of the other people in church, the purpose of the church is the same - to protect Orthodoxy and promote our faith. We are still a strong viable parish with a bright future if we work together, and I still recall a sermon of Father Kirmitsis in which he said, "A single stick is easily broken but a bundle of sticks together are strong and cannot be easily broken". I believe unity will be the key to our growth.



n November 17th, immediately after Divine Liturgy, Fathers James Retelas and Timothy Robinson awarded the Ellinomatheia certificates to Greek School students who, last May, passed the Greek language mastery exam administered by the Greek Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs. All (eleven) students who took the exam at three different levels were successful! At the A1 level (basic knowledge) six students received certification: Christofilis Chatzis, Iliana Demas, Ariadne Dimitriades, Kyriakos

Sioukas, George Tsakopoulos, Christopher Walker. Three students received certification at the B1 level

(intermediate knowledge): Ioannis Karidis, Vasiliki Kokkini, Evridiki Vougiouka. Last, two students received certification at the B2 level (advanced knowledge): Andrej Stojakovic and Mila Stojakovic. Students who are awarded Ellinomatheia certificates at B1 or B2 levels are awarded the prestigious Seal of Biliteracy upon their graduation from High School. 2019 was the first year that Annunciation Greek School operated as an exam center for the Ellinomatheia Exam. The report that was compiled by the Ellinomatheia board in the Greek Ministry of Education praised Annunciation Greek School for following best practices and meeting the guidelines and standards for Certified Ellinomatheia Exam Centers in its first year of operation.






