PASTORAL MESSAGE

Returning to the Church and to the Holy Chalice

Christ is risen! Χριστός Ανέστη!

Thankfully, after the unprecedented closing of our Church last year, we have been able to gather in worship for Holy Week and Pascha. We rejoice in Christ's Resurrection and in what we hope will be the end of the pandemic. We know that many of you have been hesitant to attend Church. Yes, we have had to limit the number of people inside the sanctuary. We are taking every precaution for your safety. Some have also told us that they are hesitant to receive Holy Communion. This is a concern to us.

We live in a secular and religiously confused and confusing culture. Many Churches believe, to be blunt, in the real absence of Jesus Christ at the Holy Table. They typically share grape juice in little individual cups with bread, leavened or unleavened, as a "memorial" of Jesus' death. (How can you have a memorial for someone who is not dead?) Here bread and wine are symbols and NOT reality. This is not our faith. We have a common Orthodox Catholic Tradition that stretches back to the Apostolic Community and to the very words of the Lord who assures his followers that they need to "eat my flesh" and "drink my blood" in order to have real life (read John chapter 6). The Early Church simply affirmed the "real" presence of Jesus Christ in the bread and wine. Theologians tried to explain this in various ways, and we can assume that people doubted this difficult doctrine from time to time. (Interestingly, the only person we know who openly questioned the "real" presence was a certain Deacon Berengarious of Tours (France) in the 11th century. He was censured.) Then comes the "Reformation" of the 16th century in the West when nearly every doctrine of the Church was held up to scrutiny and doubt, and many

Christians began to regard the Eucharist in distinctly non-supernatural ways.

We affirm that Holy Communion is the very Body and Blood of the risen Lord under the forms of bread and wine. We believe that partaking of Communion is necessary for salvation. What about germs? Since the 9th century, our Church has served Holy Communion with a common spoon. (Remember that before this everyone drank from the same Chalice.) We are emerging from a pandemic when our world was threatened by a serious respiratory virus that killed many people. Can you catch something from the Holy Chalice? You must be aware that there was a lot of discussion about this among Priests and in our Synod here in America and in the Phanar at the beginning of the pandemic in 2020. In our Metropolis, our Metropolitan instructed us to instruct you to open your mouth wide to receive Communion and not touch the spoon. But this was a necessary accommodation to everyone's fear and the perceptions of unbelievers in civil authority. The truth remains that, no, you cannot get sick from taking Communion. Let me repeat: You cannot catch anything from receiving Communion. We are not saying that disease is not a reality. Viruses are real. You could certainly get COVID-19 from physical proximity to someone who has the virus! But we believe that the very Author of Life is present in the Holy Chalice. Remember this important fact: At the end of the Divine Liturgy, what happens to the unconsumed Communion? The Priests consume the Chalices! If Holy Communion could possibly convey disease, then Fr. James and I would absolutely be sick, probably very sick, all the time. We might be dead. We are getting older, but I want to assure you that we enjoy pretty good health, thank you very much. We are not afraid of Holy Communion! The only thing we fear is displeasing the Lord. If you want to read more about this,

The pandemic has affected our behaviors. Do you avoid getting close to people? Are you nervous about shaking hands with other people? God forbid that the "reset" of this outrageous pandemic should ultimately discourage us from returning to Church or should make us afraid of Holy Communion. Yes, get vaccinated. Yes, we are still asking you to wear a mask and maintain physical distancing. These things will gradually become unnecessary. Do not give way to fear. More than ever, we need to keep our faith in God. We need to gather in Church to worship, and we need the Holy Mysteries of Christ. God offers us life and not death. Does this help alleviate your fears? If you have any questions or you need some guidance or prayer or you need to come to Confession, please call or email Fr. James or myself. If you have questions about how to prepare for Holy Communion, we would be happy to talk to you.

Carol and I were lucky enough to witness this beautiful service of ordination as were a few others from our parish. Fr. Efstratios is the 4th generation in his family to join the royal priesthood. This legacy started in 1921. This date is BEFORE the Archdiocese of America was formed. Fr. Efstratios has touched many of us and helped our priests and church immensely. We thank him for all he has done at Annunciation Sacramento and wish him and Prez. Danae our best wishes in their new assignment.

We are well past lent and Holy Week by the time you read this. Lent is a time for reflection, renewal, and almsgiving. I am often astounded and reminded each year at how smart our church fathers were for giving us the timely gospel readings and lessons around this time.

During the 2nd Sunday of Lent (St. Gregory Palamas)- I was reminded of the differences of how we experience God. While we cannot know God in His essence (God in Himself), we can know Him in his energies (the work of God's grace in our lives, and who God is in relation to the creation and mankind).

During this pandemic I found a good article helping to explain this. We have all know of the Coronavirus. With the naked eye we cannot see it (we can't see its essence) but we have seen the sickness, death, lockdowns, and destruction from this and have experienced its energies. We are called at this time to get closer to God by prayer and fasting to experience his energies and become God Like. God continues to work in the world even though the world is sickened and weak and we are fallen. By His providence, He continues to be the Good Shepherd Who gently directs His flock towards the all-good and ever-green pasture of His Kingdom. Everything that God allows to happen will benefit us in a one way or another. The difficult thing is that we are not always in the know; that sometimes the reasons are non-understandable or clear to us. Coronavirus is still very much a problem, and we all must deal with some new "norms" to allow us to worship, to see each other, as well as carry on our daily routines. Pascha this year was much more "normal" than the past year in how we can worship. We encourage all to continue to come to church but please know that if you have symptoms of Covid, we ask you to stay home and watch services virtually. If you elect to come worship with us, please know that we still need everyone to wear masks; have their temperature taken at door on entering church and keep social distance seating inside of church. Please help us with these guidelines so all can worship while keeping everyone safe. We have a "quota" of the number we can allow inside the church— 25% of our capacity. Once we reach that capacity, we will have overflow seating in the platea. Please respect this situation as we are complying with guidelines given to us. If you have a large family and want to be seated together, please come together to allow this. If we are at capacity and families come separately, we cannot allow others to join you inside due to capacity constraints. The parish council thanks you in advance for your understanding and cooperation.


