

PASTORAL MESSAGE

The Next 100 Years: Our Journey to Fullness!

Dear Faithful of Annunciation:

The first year that the festival returned to the Church grounds was especially memorable for me. Of course, it was successful financially, but the highlight was the opportunity to share our faith during the church tours and invite our guests to a special video series called "Journey to Fullness," a journey of renewal and discovery over eight weeks. The goal was a simple introduction to the Orthodox faith and how we live out our life in Christ. There was no attempt to proselytize. Conversion is a life-long process and certainly doesn't occur with the "flip of a switch." The only goal was to help each other on a journey toward "receiving the end of your faith, the salvation of your souls." (1Peter 1:9) This is our mission and core value at Annunciation. It is what motivated a handful of Greek immigrants to plant the seeds of Orthodoxy in Sacramento over 100 years ago. What motivates us today? What will propel us in our journey to fullness for the next 100 years. The answer is simple but will resound fully in our hearts and minds only by being present (come to Church!) and to ponder the mystery of the Incarnation of the Logos, the Nativity of our Lord.

On Saturday, December 25, Christmas Day, we will gather as the Body of Christ exactly 100 years after the first Divine Liturgy in the new Church on N Street was celebrated. We will gather to remember the journey of our forebears and to invoke God's grace to continue our sojourn for another 100 years, one that comports perfectly with one that began two thousand years ago, when the most transforming event the world has ever known took place in a small remote village in Palestine called Bethlehem. God's gift to us of His very Son, the eternal Logos, can never be matched. As we continue our journey to fullness this Christmas, the only meaningful gift back to Him is a grateful heart. Let us emulate the love and commitment of our forefathers and mothers in the faith who will join us this Christmas in proclaiming "Christ is Born, Glorify Him!"

Covid Fatigue Covid Fear

We have been inundated with Covid-19 for over 18 months.

We are all confused about the many "experts" telling us what to do and how to behave.

We have "Covid Fatigue" no doubt. We all know someone who has passed from this virus or been sickened seriously from this virus. Throughout the history of mankind there has been suffering from disease, sickness, and death. For some reason the heighted awareness of COVID-19 makes us hyperaware of anyone who has succumbed to, or been sickened by, this virus as opposed to being sickened or dying from heart disease, cancer, or some other disease. While we are accustomed to sickness and death, we are much less accustomed to the social stigma of getting sick or dying from Covid-19. We have had many viral diseases in past, most recently MERS, SARS, AIDS, HEPATITIS. While these affected us, they didn't change society like COVID-19 did [suggested "has"]. With Covid-19, fear is the governing principle of the world. We see panic, anxiety, anger, and much worry. We have so much fear that we have fear of fear itself. Our media tells us to live in fear of anything related to this virus and anyone who might have been exposed to this virus.

With this pandemic we currently have fear of going to church; fear of taking communion; fear of going to Sunday school; fear of who to socialize with; fear of going to school or work due to apprehension on who we will "contact" and we "might get sick".

In 2nd Timothy 1:7, we [suggested "the Apostle Paul tells us"] are told: "For God has not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind."

If God has not given us the spirit of fear — who has? The great deceiver — Satan.

This fear is antithetical to Orthodox Christianity.

Christ not only cast out unclean spirits but healed all manner of sickness and all manner of disease among the people (Matthew 10:1)

As Orthodox Christians we believe the ultimate endpoint of fear is death.

As Orthodox Christians we believe death has been conquered and destroyed by the resurrection of Jesus.

We are taught that the real church doesn't allow fear to control our life. [This last sentence does not quite make sense. "If we are members of the Church, fear should not control our lives."?] Our heart is accustomed to fear, but it needs to have an unwavering commitment in trust of God. God never promises to take away our suffering but does promise to transform our suffering into something that can bring joy. We need to approach him not with self-righteous indignation or self-pity, but with humble patient hope. The only fear we need to have is the fear of the Lord -that he will accept us in his kingdom on judgement day.

The greatest ascetics, those who lived a life of self-sacrifice until death, were filled with the fear of God. These ascetics, the most sinless among mortals, cried out in their hour of death: "God, have mercy on me a sinner!"

He who does not have the fear of God cannot have the love for God.
He who has no fear of God has no faith in God.

On December 4 th, Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church of Sacramento will cap off its year of celebrating the 100th Anniversary of our church by having a Gala dinner and dance. The day's events will start with services celebrated by his Metropolitan Gerasimos, Fr. James Retelas and Fr. Timothy Robinson marking the momentous occasion of the 100th Anniversary of our first liturgy. Maria Kaufman, 100th Anniversary Gala chair says, "An evening of dinner and dancing is planned with a strolling dinner, food catered by Hawk's, music and dancing by Mythos, and a surprise presentation." "We are planning an evening of fun and camaraderie".

The Anniversary Album is being worked on by the "writing team" of Terry Kastanis, Gerri Magers, Julie Mamalis, Toni Chapralis and Bill Triphon. All the members were impressed by the great response to the family histories. We anticipated 75 families to submit their family history and we had over 210 family and/or individual histories submitted. This was an awesome response from our community. We look forward to sharing our church's history which has been supported by Father Kirmitsis' journals and notes; Paul Manolis' History of the Orthodox Church in Sacramento; and interviews. This information was greatly enhanced by the information that our librarian and historian, Terry Kastanis, has so lovingly collected for us in the Father Demetrius Dogias library.

The book is schedule to be released in the 1st Quarter of 2022 after the Gala pictures are inserted and it goes thorough a final edit and print. The books are \$75 for those who have not purchased one already. This will be a precious keepsake for all. This book will NOT be available for digital download.

Thanks to everyone who has pitched in and helped and continue to help with this effort, you are greatly appreciated. See you on 12/4 at the Gala!!!!



LOOKING TOWARDS OUR CENTENNIAL

Those Who Influenced Me and My Mentors

The tapestry that is my life has been woven from my experiences at our beloved Annunciation Greek Orthodox church. I am eternally grateful to have been given a place where I have found faith, tradition, and a sense of belonging. I could be a part of the larger secular world with its anonymity while being surrounded in a religious world by those who cared to ensure that Orthodoxy and Hellenism were gifts to be understood and cherished.

My first introduction to Orthodoxy began with my baptism at the age of two. I had been house bound with an ear infection which meant that I was to be baptized at home. Father Mestakidis was the priest who officiated. I was the 13th and last child baptized by James and Annie Ruth Demos.

My remembrances of the old church also involved baptisms. My parents and I attended the baptismal services for two of my cousins. I cannot recall vividly the exterior of the church, while remembering that the interior walls seemed rather dark.

I seemed to be impressed with baptisms when as a four year old I asked my beloved nona Anna Jouganatos to baptize my first two dolls. I chose the name Anna to honor my nona and she chose Socrati for my other doll because she admired heroic figures in Greek history.

A major part of the tapestry of my life revolved around the Annunciation Sunday School. On any given Sunday, my mother Mary and I could be found walking on Land Park Drive to catch our first bus. Naturally, our attire included white gloves and hats. We transferred to J Street for our second bus ride. On board the bus, we saw Mr. and Mrs. Alexander with little Nick sitting on his father's lap. Somehow, we always managed to be on time which was convenient because my mother was a Sunday School teacher.

The Sunday School was located in the old Hellenic Center. We had general assemblies and then we would be divided by grade level into groups that were separated by portable partitions. Somehow, we all managed to coexist quietly maintaining our attention to the instruction of our teachers. I remember with appreciation Carolyn Liviakis, Dorothy Loris, Carolyn Kuchulis, Bess Alliopoulos, Lucille Vlahos a Sunday School teacher and director, as well as our dear friend Theodora Yazigi who served as director for 17 years. Part of the Sunday School curriculum was to attend divine liturgy officiated by our beloved Father Parthenious Kirmitsis, the first priest that I truly remember. I was honored to renew my connection with Father Kirmitsis when, at the end of his life, he had moved to a home a few blocks from my mother's residence. My mother Mary, my aunt Adrienne my daughter Maria and I would visit him. He was wise, thoughtful, and a brilliant historian who shepherded our community with love and dedication.

LOOKING TOWARDS OUR CENTENNIAL

The early years of my tapestry included the Greek lessons given in a proverbial one room schoolhouse located in the upper room of the old Hellenic Center. I, as a four-year-old, sat in row one, ahead of the rows of older students. The parents, usually mothers, sat in the back of the classroom. I did not always relish attendance at the Greek school that took place after my attendance at Crocker Elementary School and California Junior High School. I had several teachers during this ten year period, but one stood out, Mr. Anastasiou. Mr. Anastasiou was a very strict and authoritarian teacher who demanded excellence and complete attention. I was happy that I had retained some of my early Greek books that I subsequently used in teaching Greek to my students at Phoebe Hearst Elementary School.

In retrospect, all that I have accomplished in life can be traced to the influence of my beloved parents John and Mary, my grandmother Anna Jouganatos, my aunt Adrienne Drivas, my teachers, my mentors Paula Alexander, Perso Givas, and Mary Saetes. Their source of strength and inspiration stemmed from the faith, traditions, and fellowship of our cherished Greek Orthodox Church of the Annunciation.




