### January 28, 2024 15th Sunday of Luke

Mode 1 | No Fasting | 1st Morning Gospel

This Lord's Day, we remember Ephrem the Syrian; Isaac the Syrian, Bishop of Nineveh; James the Righteous; Palladios the Hermit of Antioch; Theodosius of Totma; and Grace the Martyr.

### <u>Antiphon III. Resurrection Apolytikion. Mode 1.</u>

Τοῦ λίθου σφραγισθέντος ὑπὸ τῶν Ἰουδαίων, καὶ στρατιωτῶν φυλασσόντων τὸ ἄχραντόν σου Σῶμα, ἀνέστης τριήμερος Σωτήρ, δωρούμενος τῷ κόσμῳ τὴν ζωήν· διὰ τοῦτο αἱ Δυνάμεις τῶν οὐρανῶν ἐβόων σοι ζωοδότα. Δόξα τῆ ἸΑναστάσει σου Χριστέ, δόξα τῆ βασιλεία σου, δόξα τῆ οἰκονομία σου, μόνε φιλάνθρωπε.

The stone had been secured with a seal by the Judeans, \* and a guard of soldiers was watching Your immaculate body. \* You rose on the third day, O Lord \* and Savior, granting life unto the world. \* For this reason were the powers of heaven crying out to

Apolytikion for St. Ephrem the Syrian, Plagal 4 Mode: Ταῖς τῶν δακρύων σου ροαῖς, τῆς

ἐρήμου τὸ ἄγονον ἐγεώργησας, καὶ τοῖς ἐκ βάθους στεναγμοῖς, εἰς ἑκατὸν τοὺς πόνους ἐκαρποφόρησας, καὶ γέγονας φωστὴρ τῆ οἰκουμένη, λάμπων τοῖς θαύμασιν, Ἐφραὶμ πατὴρ ἡμῶν ὅσιε, πρέσβευε Χριστῷ τῷ Θεῷ, σωθῆναι τὰς ψυχὰς ἠμῶν.

With the rivers of your tears you made the barren desert bloom; and with your sighs from deep within, you made your labors bear their fruits a hundredfold; and you became a star, illuminating the world by your miracles, O Ephrem, our devout father. Intercede with Christ our God, for the salvation of our souls.

**Apolytikion of the Church, Mode 4:** Σήμερον τῆς σωτηρίας ἡμῶν τὸ Κεφάλαιον, καὶ τοῦ ἀπ' αἰῶνος Μυστηρίου ἡ φανέρωσις, ὁ Υἱὸς τοῦ Θεοῦ, Υἱὸς τῆς Παρθένου γίνεται, καὶ Γαβριὴλ τὴν χάριν εὐαγγελίζεται. Διὸ καὶ ἡμεῖς σὺν αὐτῷ τὴ Θεοτόκω βοήσωμεν· Χαῖρε Κεχαριτωμένη, ὁ Κύριος μετὰ σοῦ.

Today is the crowning moment of our salvation, and the unfolding of the eternal mystery: the Son of God becomes the Son of the Virgin, and Gabriel brings the good tidings of grace. Therefore, with him let us also cry aloud to the Mother of God: Hail, full of grace! The Lord is with you.

Festal Kontakion, Mode 1: 'Ο μήτραν παρθενικὴν ἁγιάσας τῷ τόκῳ σου, καὶ χεῖρας τοῦ Συμεὼν εὐλογήσας ὡς ἔπρεπε, προφθάσας καὶ νῦν ἔσωσας ἡμᾶς Χριστὲ ὁ Θεός. ἀλλ' εἰρήνευσον ἐν πολέμοις τὸ πολίτευμα, καὶ κραταίωσον Βασιλεῖς οὺς ἠγάπησας, ὁ μόνος φιλάνθρωπος.

You sanctified the virginal womb by Your birth, O Lord, and blessed the hands of Symeon fittingly, O Christ God; and even now You came and saved us. Now, give peace to our Nation in time of war, and empower our Leaders, so loved by You, the only one who loves humanity.

After the Trisagion Hymn:

#### Prokeimenon of the Apostle. Mode 1. Psalm 32.

Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us, as we hope in You.

Rejoice greatly in the Lord, O righteous ones; praise is fitting for the upright.

The reading is from St. Paul's First Letter to Timothy (4:9-15): TIMOTHY, my son, the saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance. For to this end we toil and strive, because we have our hope set on the living God, who is the Savior of all men, especially of those who believe. Command and teach these things. Let no one despise your youth, but set the believers an example in speech and conduct, in love, in faith, in purity. Till I come, attend to the public reading of scripture, to preaching, to teaching. Do not neglect the gift you have, which was given you by prophetic utterance when the council of elders laid their hands upon you. Practice these duties, devote yourself to them, so that all may see your progress.

#### Alleluia.

The Gospel Reading is from Luke (19:1-10): AT THAT TIME, Jesus entered Jericho and was passing through. And there was a man named Zacchaios; he was a chief collector, and rich. And he sought to see who Jesus was, but could not, on account of the crowd, because he was small of stature. So he ran on ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see him, for he was to pass that way. And when Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaios, make haste and come down; for I must stay at your house today." So he made haste and came down, and received him joyfully. And when they saw it they all murmured, "He has gone in to be the

guest of a man who is a sinner." And Zacchaios stood and said to the Lord, "Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor; and if I have defrauded any one of anything, I restore it fourfold." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, since he also is a son of Abraham. For the Son of man came to seek and to save the lost."



#### The Three Hierarchs Academic Lecture Series continues with

### "Lamento Con Alas (Lament with Wings)"

presented by Carlos Colón



The Psalms of David have given composers the words to exalt Jesus Christ and pray to God in times of personal and national tragedies. As a composer, Carlos has been deeply influenced by the testimony of the Eastern Fathers: St. Basil the Great, St. Gregory of Nyssa, St. Athanasios the Great, and St. John Chrysostom, to name a few. He invites all Christians to rediscover the Christ-proclaiming Psalms and find "tranquility of the soul as an arbiter of peace," as St. Basil taught, and to include them in our families' activities, especially at the table as St. John encouraged. Carlos will also testify to some of the treasures he has found in St. Athanasios' Letter to Marcellinus concerning the Psalms. The talk will also feature some of Colón's choral compositions and hymns (including some for children) inspired by the Psalms.



Carlos Colón is a composer, liturgist, and cultural promoter whose recent projects lie at the intersection of social justice and religious change. Colón's experiences of immigration and violent conflict inform his compositions' calls to justice, peace, and beauty. Born in Chalchuapa, El Salvador, Colón was forced to flee his home at the age of fourteen due to the civil war. A resident of the United States since 1986, he holds a master's degree in music from Baylor University, is the Assistant Director of Chapel at

Baylor University, and is a resident scholar at Baylor's Institute for Studies of Religion. Colón's compositions include a Te Deum for the canonization of Archbishop Oscar Romero and a Requiem for the victims of the El Mozote massacre. GIA Music and MorningStar have published his compositions, and they appear in various hymnals.
