A Message From Fr. Vinnie


Glory to God, we have embarked on our Lenten journey! This glorious journey is one that comes year after year, a journey that will end with the glorious Resurrection of our Lord God and Savior, Jesus Christ. These forty or so days will be rigorous and challenging but if we approach it with the right mindset, we will challenge ourselves to prepare to participate in this most special and blessed feast. Lent is an opportunity to rededicate ourselves and focus on getting closer to Christ. It is easy to become overwhelmed with the many duties and responsibilities that come with Lent so I'd like to offer a few suggestions to make this Great Fast more approachable:

- 1. Try not to sweat the small stuff! Remember, the overall goal of Holy and Great Lent is that we and our family members cleanse our souls, simplify our lives, exercise and practice a greater degree of love and self-sacrifice, and prepare for the Feast of Pascha. Don't stress about monitoring every single ingredient label for proper fasting items, or panic when we realize that we accidentally ate dairy or oil. Let's not set up standards of perfection that will quickly fall (and fail) to the practical realities of day to day life.
- 2. Prepare yourself! Setting ourselves up for success is often the key to a strong start (and stronger finish!). Create a Lent-friendly kitchen and plan meals ahead. Remember that prayer before and after meals is truly important. "A family that prays together, stays together!"
- 3. Eat together as a family and have conversations about church and the fast! Ask, "why do we fast?" Discuss the importance of the Sunday's of Lent.
- 4. At the very least, pick one service a week to go to. We are offering Great Compline on Monday, Presanctified Liturgy on Wednesday and Salutations to the Theotokos on Friday. Pick one of these beautiful weekday services and attend with your whole family. Following the service, enjoy a Lenten meal together at a local restaurant and talk about the service.
- 5. Find a church task during Lent and Holy Week for everyone to participate with. Bake prosphora (the Holy offering bread for Liturgy), egg dyeing, decorate the church during Holy Week etc. We are ALWAYS in need of volunteers to help especially during this time of year.

The harder and more diligently we prepare for Lent, the more joyous and rewarding the feast of Pascha will be. Join Fr. Timothy and myself on this most blessed journey of Holy and Great Lent. We are here for you and want to serve and assist you and your family as best as we can. May God give us the strength to endure Great and Holy Lent!

STEWARDSHIP FACTS

Q: DO MY RECURRING STEWARDSHIP PAYMENTS ROLLOVER FROM YEAR-TO-YEAR?

A: In past years, recurring stewardship payments have NOT rolled over to the next year and stewards were required to create new pledges and payments at the beginning of the year. For 2025, recurring payments from 2024 will continue on unless stopped by the giver. If you would like to check your 2025 stewardship status or make changes to your recurring payment, please login to your PushPay account at pushpay.com/login or contact the Annunciation Financial Office at accounting@annunciationsac.org.

Q: WHAT DOES MY STEWARDSHIP PAY FOR?

A: In 2025, it will cost approximately \$3,500/day to keep the church open. Most operating expenses are paid from stewardship. Some examples are utilities, office staff and pastoral salaries, candles, permits, security, and facilities maintenance. Additional costs are directly related to church-funded ministries and programs.

Q: I ALREADY PAY FOR GREEK DANCE, GREEK SCHOOL, ETC. WHY DO I HAVE TO ALSO PAY FOR STEWARDSHIP?


A: These programs operate independently from our general operating budget. The church provides the facility, in addition to facility-related expenses, enabling their operation and receives no money from these ministries. It is also important that families participating in our children's ministries be currently pledged stewards.

SACRAMENTO GREEK FESTIVAL




Fellow parishioners, please forgive us, the Festival Committee, if we've wronged you in the past year. (Yesterday was forgiveness Sunday.) $K\alpha\lambda\eta$ $\Sigma\alpha\rho\alpha\kappa\sigma\sigma\eta$!

As the Lenten season dawns anew today, we take time to enjoy this time of fasting as right behind it starts the season of festivals! I was recently talking with a cousin of mine, commenting on this festival I had been to or that one I was going to and she observed that for the less social media savvy, it's harder to learn about other local festivals. After this article, you'll find a list of all the Greek Festivals, and a few greater Mediterranean, within 100 miles of our Parish sorted by date, culminating with our 62nd Greek Festival on October 3-4-5, 2025.

In order for us to make it to our festival with grounds ready to welcome guests and tons of goodies to serve, we need our Annunciation parishioners to show up with the donation of time, talent, and treasure. Here are ways you can help your Annunciation ministries (who are the beneficiaries of Festival funds) by supporting the Greek Festival:

Time & Talent: This is a multifaceted aspect. We need leadership but also labor. Without either, the festival cannot maintain our excellent food quantity, quality, and wonderful service.

- **Pre-Festival Leadership:** Volunteers are needed to chair the preparation of Paximathia, Melomacarona, & Kourambiethes. We have the recipes, we'll have the ingredients, all we need is your supervision.
- **Festival Leadership:** New chairs are needed for the Pandepoleon, Donations, and Raffle Booth. We're also looking for a new head of Procurement this will be a 3-year path from internship with our current Procurement to autonomous leadership.
- **Pre-Festival Labor:** We need all hands on deck to make the mass quantities of food we serve our 10,000 guests. Sure, a yiayia can whip out a homemade 9x13 baklava (~30 pieces) in less than an hour, but did you know we made more than 9,000 pieces of baklava last year. Baklava, and all our other delicious foods, require upwards of 50 volunteers per day, to make. The old adage still rings true... *Many hands make light work.* Food preparations will begin after Easter. More information on specific baking days will be provided once we get closer via Friday emails and Sunday Bulletins.
- Festival Labor: Nearly every festival booth chair provided the same feedback: "We need more volunteers!" We hope you'll consider joining us for a volunteer shift. It's a great way to connect with friends and meet new people. We all need to channel Konstantine Kalfountzos' (right) pride and excitement to volunteer in the gyro booth last year. Recruitment will begin in late summer.



- **Underwriting of Menu Items:** Eggs for pastries, meats for the grill, and much more are available to be underwritten!
- **Sponsor the Event:** From \$500 up to \$5,000+, we are truly grateful for these monetary contributions. Event sponsors are recognized on the website, at the event, and on social media.
