Holy Pentecost June 8, 2025

No Fasting all week! | Festal Modes | Festal Orthros Gospel (John 20:19-23)

On this Lord's Day, the 8th Day of June, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Feast of Pentecost following the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ; we also remember the Removal of the Relics of Theodore the Commander; Kalliope the Martyr; Melania the Righteous; Anastasios the New Martyr of Constantinople; Theophanes the New Martyr of Constantinople.

Antiphon 1. Mode 2. Psalm 18.

Verse 1: The heavens declare the glory of God: the firmament shows the creation of his hands.

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, Savior, save us.

Verse 2: Day to day utters the word: and night to night reveals knowledge. Ref.

Verse 3: There is no speech nor language where their voices are not heard. Ref.

Verse 4: Their proclamation went forth into all the earth, and their words to the ends of the world. *Ref.*

Glory to the Father... Both now and forever... Ref.

Antiphon 2. Mode 2. Psalm 19.

Verse 1: May the Lord hear you in the day of afflictions; may the name of the God of Jacob defend you.

Refrain: Save us, O good Comforter. We sing to You, Alleluia.

Verse 2: May he send you help from His holy place, and may He support you from Zion.

Refrain: Σῶσον ἡμᾶς, Παράκλητε ἀγαθέ, ψάλλοντάς σοι, Ἀλληλούϊα.

Verse 3: May he remember every sacrifice of yours, and may your whole burnt offering be honored. *Ref.*

Glory to the Father... Both now and forever... Only begotten Son and Word of God...

Antiphon 3. Mode pl. 4. Psalm 20.

Verse 1: O Lord, the king shall be glad in Your power, and in Your salvation he will greatly rejoice.

Verse 2: You gave him his soul's desire, and You did not deprive him of his lips' request.

Verse 3: For You anticipated him with blessings of goodness; You placed a crown of precious stones on his head. Verse 4: He asked You for life, and You gave it to him, length of days unto ages of ages.

Refrain (Apolytikion of the Feast): Blessed are You, O Christ our God. You sent down the Holy Spirit into the fishermen, and You gave them knowledge and wisdom in everything; and through them, as in a net You caught the whole world. O Lord who loves humanity, glory to You!

Entrance Hymn. Mode 2. Psalm 20:13. (Υψώθητι Κύριε)

Be exalted, O Lord, in your power: we will sing and praise your mighty deeds. Save us, O good Comforter. We sing to you: Alleluia!

Of the Feast. Mode Plagal 4: Εὐλογητός εἶ, Χριστὲ ὁ Θεὸς ἡμῶν, ὁ πανσόφους τοὺς ἁλιεῖς ἀναδείξας, καταπέμψας αὐτοῖς τὸ Πνεῦμα τὸ ἅγιον, καὶ δι' αὐτῶν τὴν οἰκουμένην σαγηνεύσας, Φιλάνθρωπε, δόξα σοι.

Blessed are You, O Christ our God. You sent down the Holy Spirit into the fishermen, and You gave them knowledge and wisdom in everything; and through them, as in a net You caught the whole world. O Lord who loves humanity, glory to You!

Kontakion of the Feast. Mode Plagal 4: Ότε καταβάς τὰς γλώσσας συνέχεε, διεμέριζεν έθνη ὁ Ύψιστος· ὅτε τοῦ πυρὸς τὰς γλώσσας διένειμεν, εἰς ἑνότητα πάντας ἐκάλεσε· καὶ συμφώνως δοξάζομεν τὸ Πανάγιον Πνεῦμα.

When the Most High came down and confused the tongues, he divided the nations. When He distributed the tongues of fire, He called all to unity. And with one voice we glorify the All-holy Spirit.'

Instead of the Trisagion Hymn: Όσοι εἰς Χριστὸν ἐβαπτίσθητε, Χριστὸν ἐνεδύσασθε. Άλληλούϊα.

As many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. Alleluia.

After: Order of the New Testament Readings

Prokeimenon of the Apostle. Mode Plagal 4. Psalm 18.

Their proclamation went forth into all the earth, and their words to the ends of the world.

The heavens declare the glory of God; the firmament shows the creation of His hands.

The reading is from the Acts of the Apostles (2:1-11): WHEN THE DAY of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontos and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians, we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God."

Alleluia.

The Gospel Reading is from John (7:37-52; 8:12): ON THE LAST DAY OF THE FEAST, the great day, Jesus stood up and proclaimed, "If any one thirst, let him come to me and drink. He who believes in me, as the scripture has said, 'Out of his heart shall flow rivers of living water.'" Now this he said about the Spirit, which those who believed in him were to receive; for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified. When they heard these words, some of the people said, "This is really the prophet." Others said, "This is the Christ." But some said, "Is the Christ to come from Galilee? Has not the scripture said that the Christ is

descended from David, and comes from Bethlehem, the village where David was?" So there was a division among the people over him. Some of them wanted to arrest him, but no one laid hands on him. The officers then went back to the chief priest and Pharisees, who said to them, "Why did you not bring him?" The officers answered, "No man ever spoke like this man!" The Pharisees answered them, "Are you led astray, you also? Have any of the authorities or of the Pharisees believed in him? But this crowd, who do not know the law, are accursed." Nikodemos, who had gone to him before, and who was one of them, said to them, "Does our law judge a man without first giving him a hearing and learning what he does?" They replied, "Are you from Galilee too? Search and you will see that no prophet is to rise from Galilee." Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

THE DIVINE LITURGY OF SAINT JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

Instead of 'It is truly right', Grave Mode (M η t η $\zeta \phi \theta o \rho \tilde{\alpha} \zeta$): When you conceived, you experienced no deflowerment. * You lent your flesh to the Logos, through whom all things were made. * Therefore we magnify you, Virgin Theotokos, * Mother who knew no man, space and holder of your Maker, who is uncontainable and infinite.

Communion Hymn (Τό Πνεῦμα σου): Your good Spirit shall guide me in a land of uprightness. Alleluia.

Instead of 'We have seen the true Light', the Apolytikion of the Feast (Εὐλογητός εἶ): Blessed are you...

STEWARDSHIP FACTS

Q: DO MY RECURRING STEWARDSHIP PAYMENTS ROLLOVER FROM YEAR-TO-YEAR?

A: In past years, recurring stewardship payments have NOT rolled over to the next year and stewards were required to create new pledges and payments at the beginning of the year. For 2025, recurring payments from 2024 will continue on unless stopped by the giver. If you would like to check your 2025 stewardship status or make changes to your recurring payment, please login to your PushPay account at pushpay.com/login or contact the Annunciation Financial Office at accounting@annunciationsac.org.

Q: WHAT DOES MY STEWARDSHIP PAY FOR?

A: In 2025, it will cost approximately \$3,500/day to keep the church open. Most operating expenses are paid from stewardship. Some examples are utilities, office staff and pastoral salaries, candles, permits, security, and facilities maintenance. Additional costs are directly related to church-funded ministries and programs.

Q: I ALREADY PAY FOR GREEK DANCE, GREEK SCHOOL, ETC. WHY DO I HAVE TO ALSO PAY FOR STEWARDSHIP?

A: These programs operate independently from our general operating budget. The church provides the facility, in addition to facility-related expenses, enabling their operation and receives no money from these ministries. It is also important that families participating in our children's ministries be currently pledged stewards.
