Striving brilliantly for Orthodoxy, and subduing all unorthodoxy, * you were honored with awards for your victories. * Enriching all with inspired theology, * your sacred writings profoundly adorn

the Church. O Athanasius and Cyril, you are now with Christ our God, *entreating Him to give to all the great mercy.

Today is the crowning moment of our salvation, and the unfolding of the eternal mystery: the Son of God becomes the Son of the Virgin, and Gabriel brings the good tidings of grace. Therefore, with him let us also cry aloud to the Mother of God: Hail, full of grace! The Lord is with you.

Festal Kontakion (for the Meeting in the Temple, February 2), Mode 1: Ὁ μήτραν παρθενικὴν ἀγιάσας τῷ τόκῳ σου, καὶ χεῖρας τοῦ Συμεὼν εὐλογήσας ὡς ἔπρεπε, προφθάσας καὶ νῦν ἔσωσας ἡμᾶς Χριστὲ ὁ Θεός. Ἄλλ' εἰρήνευσον ἐν πολέμοις τὸ πολίτευμα, καὶ κραταίσον Βασιλεῖς οὓς ἡγάπησας, ὁ μόνος φιλάνθρωπος.

You sanctified the virginal womb by Your birth, O Lord, and blessed the hands of Symeon fittingly, O Christ God; and even now You came and saved us. Now, give peace to our Nation in time of war, and empower our Leaders, so loved by You, the only one who loves humanity.

After the Trisagion Hymn:

Prokeimenon of the Apostle. Mode 4. The Prayer of Azariah.

Blessed are You, O Lord God of our fathers.

For You are righteous in all You did for us.

The Reading is from the Holy Apostle Paul's Letter to the Hebrews (13:7-16): Brethren, remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God; consider the outcome of their lives, and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. Do not be led away by diverse and strange teachings; for it is well that the heart be strengthened by grace, not by foods, which have not benefited their adherents. We have an altar from which those who serve the tent have no right to eat. For the bodies of those animals whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest as a sacrifice for sin are burned outside the camp. So Jesus also suffered outside the gate in order to sanctify the people through his own blood. Therefore let us go forth to him outside the camp and bear the abuse he endured. For here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city which is to come. Through him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

The Gospel Reading is from Luke (17:12-19): At that time, as Jesus entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance and lifted up their voices and said: "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." When he saw them he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went they were cleansed. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus's feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. Then said Jesus: "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" And he said to him: "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well."





STEWARDSHIP FACTS

Q: DO MY RECURRING STEWARDSHIP PAYMENTS ROLLOVER FROM YEAR-TO-YEAR?

A: Beginning in 2024, our parish transitioned to recurring stewardship payments that automatically roll over into the next year. In previous years, recurring payments did not carry forward, and stewards needed to create a new pledge and payment schedule each January. For 2026, any recurring payment you established in 2025 will continue automatically unless you choose to make a change.

If you would like to review your 2026 stewardship status, update your recurring payment, or make any adjustments, please log in to your PushPay account at pushpay.com/login or contact the Annunciation Financial Office at accounting@annunciationsac.org. We are happy to assist you.

Q: WHAT DOES MY STEWARDSHIP PAY FOR?

A: In 2026, it will cost over \$3,700 per day to keep our parish open and operating. The majority of these essential expenses are covered by stewardship. This includes items such as utilities, office and pastoral staff salaries, candles, permits, security, and facilities maintenance. In addition, many of our ministries, programs, and events rely directly on church-funded support to thrive.

Your stewardship is what makes all of this possible—ensuring that Annunciation remains a place of worship, community, and spiritual growth for every family who calls our parish home.

Q: I ALREADY PAY FOR GREEK DANCE, GREEK SCHOOL, ETC. WHY DO I HAVE TO ALSO PAY FOR STEWARDSHIP?

A: These programs operate independently of our parish's general operating budget. While the church provides the facilities and covers all facility- and administrative-related expenses needed for their operation, the ministries themselves do not generate income for the parish.

For this reason, it is important that families participating in our children's ministries are current pledged stewards. Your stewardship helps ensure that these programs remain available, safe, and vibrant for all of our youth.

Q: IF I DONATE TO A MEMORIAL FUND, BUILDING FUND, FESTIVAL, OR EVENT, DOES THAT COUNT AS PART OF MY STEWARDSHIP?

A: No. Your stewardship is represented entirely by your stated gift commitment.

Q: IS THERE A DIFFERENCE BETWEEN "DUES" & "STEWARDSHIP"?

A: Yes. In past generations, it was common for families throughout our Archdiocese to pay annual "dues"—a fixed membership fee required to belong to a parish. Over time, it became clear that this model did not reflect the full life of the Church. Giving often remained unchanged year after year, and participation could feel more transactional than meaningful. For perspective, the annual dues of \$300–\$350 at that time would be equivalent to approximately \$2,500–\$3,000 today.
