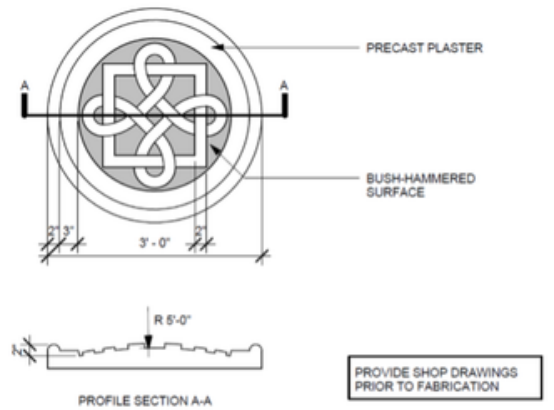
2026 ANNUNCIATION PARISH COUNCIL

SQUARE WITHIN AN INFINITY CROSS ORIGIN STORY



The design process for the Hellenic center incorporated a subtle element above the main entry to reflect the religious connection of the building to our campus: a round medallion with a simple, yet impactful motif. With so many designs and shapes from which to choose, project architect Dan Eriksson began to look for an appropriate and unique element. Our church itself was the place to begin since it offers many examples in the iconography and other artistic features. The infinity cross is on our parish Kouvouklion, the carved wooden recreation of the tomb of Christ that is decorated with flowers and processed around the church on Holy Friday. Father James Retelas and the building committee agreed that this type of cross would be appropriate for a building that was not a church.

The medallion is fabricated of cast stone, a highly refined form of precast concrete that mimics the appearance and qualities of quarried stone. This material also adorns the main entry and the pre-function room. Dan developed an architectural detail for the plans, whereby a mold was created to cast the desired shape and profiles. This design element is now our identifiable motif, used as a logo on communications here at Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church.

SCALE: 3/4" = 1'-0"



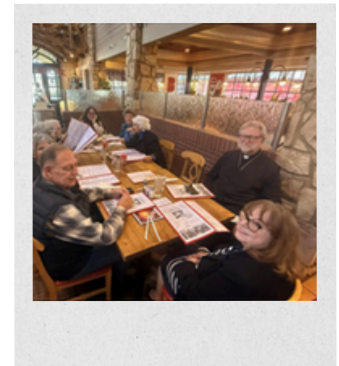
ANNUNCIATION SENIOR LEAGUE

After the church visit, the group, accompanied by the clergy, went to the nearby Brookfields Restaurant, where they enjoyed a pleasant meal and warm fellowship.



February Luncheon at St. Katherine's

As in previous years, the February ASL luncheon took place at St. Katherine Church in Elk Grove. The event was well attended, and everyone enjoyed both the delicious food and the company of fellow members. The guest speaker was a representative from the American Heart Association, who spoke to the group about maintaining heart health, managing high blood pressure, and responding effectively in case of an emergency.





LENTEN YOUTH RETREAT: A JOYFUL JOURNEY TO PASCHA

On the Saturday of Lazarus, our Annunciation parish was blessed to host our annual Lenten Youth Retreat, bringing together over 50 children for a meaningful morning of faith, fellowship, and preparation for Holy Week.

Following the Divine Liturgy, the youth joined members of our parish community for the beloved Lenten Breakfast, generously hosted by Philoptochos. This cherished tradition offered a beautiful opportunity for fellowship across generations, setting the tone for the day ahead. After breakfast, parishioners of all ages worked side by side to fold over 1,300 palm crosses, which were distributed to the faithful on Palm Sunday—a powerful expression of shared service and preparation.

The retreat continued with three engaging and hands-on rotations designed to help the children connect more deeply with the meaning of Lent and the journey toward Pascha.

In the Jr. Choir rotation, Mark Powell of Cappella Romana, our visiting chanter for Holy Week, joined Fr. Vinnie in teaching the children the Hymn of the Three Young Men in both Greek and English. It was especially moving to see several of our youth later participate in the Holy Saturday morning Divine Liturgy, offering this hymn as part of the Church's celebration.

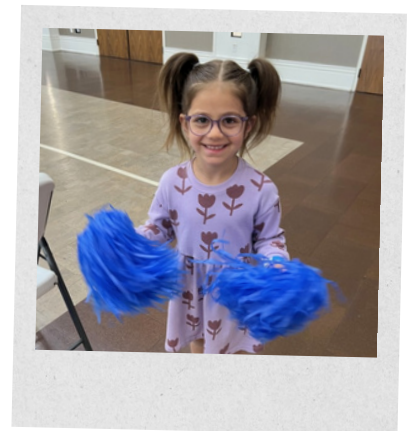
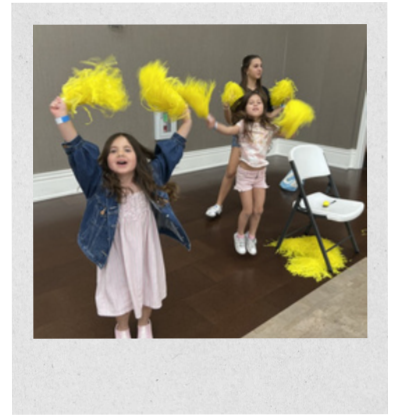
The prosphoron baking rotation, led by Gary Leonard, gave the children the opportunity to take part in one of the most sacred traditions of our faith. Together, they prepared over 50 loaves of prosphoron, which were used during Palm Sunday Liturgy and in the preparation of Holy Communion—an incredible and tangible connection to the life of the Church.

In the "Journey to Pascha" obstacle course, led by Nicki Hansen, the children experienced the Lenten journey in a dynamic and memorable way. As they moved through each part of the course—balancing, navigating obstacles, working together, and trying again when they missed the mark—they were reminded that Lent is a journey filled with challenges, perseverance, and growth. Just as they faced obstacles along the course, we reflected on the struggles we encounter during Lent and in our daily lives. The activity emphasized that we do not walk this journey alone. Through teamwork, the children experienced the importance of supporting one another, just as we are supported by our Church, our families, and our friends. The course also pointed to the ultimate goal of our Lenten journey: the joy of the Resurrection. Just as the children pressed on to reach the finish, we are called to persevere in faith, continually turning back to God, until we arrive at the celebration of Pascha.

We were also blessed to have two seminarians—Aaron Davis and George Tzikas, both former Annunciation youth—visiting from Holy Cross in Boston. Their presence was especially meaningful as they assisted with the retreat and served as inspiring examples of faith and continued growth in Christ.

We are deeply grateful to our clergy, volunteers, and youth leaders who made this day possible, offering their time, energy, and care to create such a special experience for our children. May the seeds planted during this retreat continue to grow as our youth journey in faith.

The Lenten Youth Retreat was a beautiful reflection of our parish life, bringing together children, families, and parishioners across generations in preparation for Holy Week. We look forward to continuing this journey together as we proclaim, "Christ is Risen!"





SACRAMENTO GREEK FESTIVAL

Χριστός Ανέστη!

The Greek Festival Executive Board enjoyed a restful post-festival season and has begun easing back into the year, holding our first meeting in early March. As we do each year, we reflected on our successes and challenges, always looking for ways to improve on the past. Our 2025 Festival was truly exceptional; delicious food, wonderful guests, and beautiful weather. It set the bar pretty bar; we look forward to building on that success in 2026!

To ensure our festival grounds are ready to welcome guests—and filled with our delicious offerings—we invite our Annunciation parishioners to share their time, talent, and treasure. Your support directly benefits our Annunciation ministries. Below are meaningful ways you can help make the 2026 Greek Festival a success:

Time & Talent: This is a multifaceted aspect. We need leadership but also labor. Without either, the festival cannot maintain our excellent food quantity, quality, and wonderful service.

- **Pre-Festival Leadership:** Volunteers are needed to chair the preparation of our pastries and their components: Koulourakia, Paximathia, Melomakarona, Kourambietes, Galaktobouriko, and Baklava.
 - For the cookies, we have the recipes, we'll have the ingredients, all we need is your supervision.
 - Baklava and Galaktobouriko are slightly different entities. We'd like to break the components amongst a few teams of 2-4 people for the syrup, nuts, and assembly. These teams would work with our current Baklava and Galaktobouriko chairs to learn from their decades of knowledge on these beloved festival staples. The nuts and syrup team(s) are vital as these items are used in Melomakarona, Galaktobouriko, Baklava, Loukoumades, and Yiourtopita but are only prepared once. This year would be a transition year with autonomous leadership next year (2027 Festival).
- **Festival Leadership:** New chairs are needed for the Estiatorio and Donations. We're also looking for a new head of Procurement - this will be an internship with our current Procurement chair to autonomous leadership next year (2027 Festival).
- **Pre-Festival Labor:** We need all hands on deck to make the mass quantities of food we serve our 10,000 guests. Sure, a yiayia can whip out a homemade 9x13 baklava (~30 pieces) in less than an hour, but did you know we'll need more than 9,000 pieces of baklava in October? Baklava, and all our other delicious foods, require upwards of 50 volunteers per day, to make. The old adage still rings true... Many hands make light work. Food preparations will begin after Easter. More information on specific baking days will be provided once we get closer via Friday emails and Sunday Bulletins.
- **Festival Labor:** Nearly every festival booth chair provided the same feedback: "We need more volunteers!" We hope you'll consider joining us for a volunteer shift. Grab members from your Fraternal organizations and sign up to work a shift together. It's a great way to connect with friends and meet new people. Recruitment will begin in late summer.

Treasure: Each year, we are blessed with contributions to help cover our event expenses. In early summer, our Donation and Sponsorship drive will begin. Once we get closer, donations can be made in person after church, to the church office, and online. More information will be provided via Friday emails and Sunday Bulletins.

- **Underwriting of Menu Items:** Eggs for pastries, meats for the grill, and much more are available to be underwritten!

- **Sponsor the Event:** From \$500 to beyond \$10,000, we are truly grateful for these monetary contributions. Event sponsors are recognized on the website, at the event, and on social media. The Greek Festival has a strong, organic following on social media with over 5,000 followers! We will promote your sponsorship and your business name.

Several people who have donated their time and talent to our festival are retiring this year. After three years, Katherine Rotas (Festival Souviners booth), Gary Leonard and Irina Rebegeanu (Estiatorio / Ala Carte) will be stepping down from their official positions.



Koula Fotopoulos has also retired from her role as PR chair. For the past twelve years, every media interaction, whether it was print, radio, or TV – in studio or on our grounds, prearranged or spontaneous, taped or live, has had Koula’s skillful touch behind it. Her industry knowledge has helped to drive tens of thousands of guests to our festival, both at the Convention Center and our own church grounds, during her tenure. Her calm demeanor, whether she was the interviewee or supporting others being interviewed, has helped her craft a wonderful team of on-air ‘personalities’ to put their best foot forward in support of our festival.

THANK YOU, KOULA! Your expertise has been invaluable, and you have been an incredible champion of the festival over the past twelve years. We are deeply grateful for your long-standing dedication! Enjoy retirement!

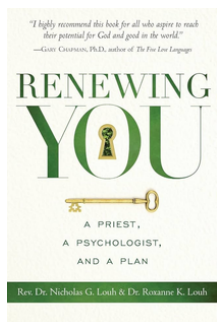

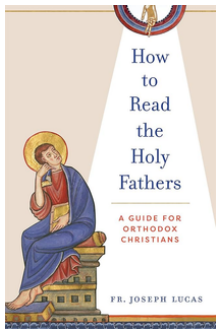
Spring is the time for renewal and what better way to renew yourself than to refresh your spirit with a good read. Consider one of these:

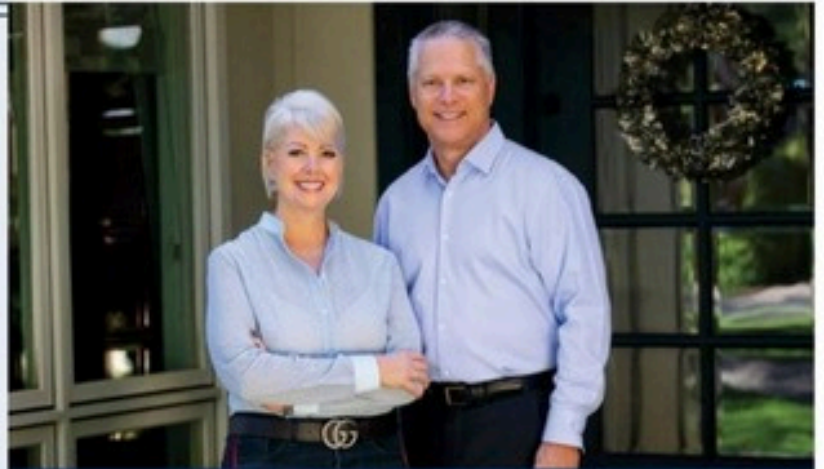
